

Filmi Chashma Childrens Film Festival at NFAI from 13th to 15th May 2011

The registration for the childrens **Filmi Chashma Film Festival** starts from Sunday 1st May in NFAI campus and can be done in between 5 to 8 pm. The registration is free, open to all on first come first served basis , and one adult member is allowed to accompany the youngest group.

The festival specially designed for the different age groups who have different tastes will enable the children to watch films and know more about the films through the additional information shared by the experts in communication media. The films include purely entertainment films, animation films as well as live action films from different countries and of course from our own Children Film Society of India. Among the films that will be screened include interesting films such as **Krish Trish and Baltiboy** a story about Krish a monkey, Trish a cat and Baltiboy a donkey who are 3 minstrels who take you on an exotic journey to the land of Indian Folk tales and folk music. These endearing characters take you to three different regions of India . The children can discover folk wisdom presented in an artistic manner through magnificent folk art and watch how this magnificent art comes alive through the medium of animation.

Lilkee a film by Batul Mehta made in 2007, is a story of a 10 year old domestic help from Nainital brought to Mumbai by a young architect – Bela. Lilkee finds it difficult to adjust with the city life.

Please Vote for Me, a Chinese film made by Weijun Chen, in 2007, is a portrait of a society and a town in China called Wuhan, through the medium of a primary school, its children and its families.

Khel Khel Mein, and **Jhat Pat Ghich Pich**, two short films made by two young filmmakers Mahima Kaur & Varun Halder, in 2010 are also part of the interesting fare at the festival.

The event has been co-organized by Comet Media, an NGO interested in promoting this activity though out the country.
